After speaking with my parents the lady assisted with the organisation and planning for me to go abroad. We set up a GoFundMe page and my dad prepared to drive to Croatia so I could take up this opportunity. We set off on July 6th 2025 and stopped in Frankfurt, Germany and Austria. It took two and a half days to arrive at our hotel near Stadium Millenium where the FIM Women's Speedway Academy and FIM Women's Speedway Trophy of Croatia was taking place. We then had a two day training camp with a world champion, Greg Hancock. After the two days it was then race day. My dad and I had no expectations as the other girls had been riding since they were six or seven. I had my first race and came 1st! I then had three other races and came 1st in all of them meaning I was crowned Fim Womens Speedway Of Croatia Champion!

An inspiring day was had by all, and we even heard about some new findings (only published a couple of weeks ago) from the James Webb Space Telescope which radically changed our understanding of how galaxies formed in the early universe.

The audience were treated to a range of music from a phenomenal Led Zeppelin guitar solo to beautifully delivered piano pieces by Scarlatti and Debussy. The Ipswich Art Society organised the exhibition and hosted it at the **UCS** Waterfront Gallery overlooking Neptune Quay. The longestablished exhibition is renowned for showcasing the talents of young artists aged 16-20 from around the county. Indeed, all the submitted Northgate entries were short-listed from a huge entry of student work from the Ipswich area and beyond. This year's exhibition highlighted







the exceptional calibre of emerging young artists, and the winning entry stands out as a remarkable testament to both technical skill and creative maturity. Daniel's work demonstrates an artistic voice far beyond his years, producing a piece that is not only visually compelling but also environmentally resonant.
